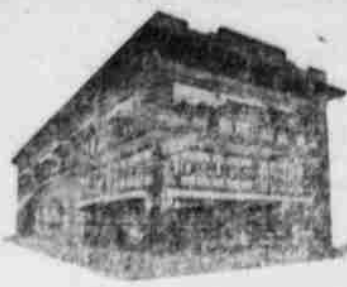
E. E. Morrison and family returned last Monday from a trip of a week or more into Central California, a combination of business and recreation.
