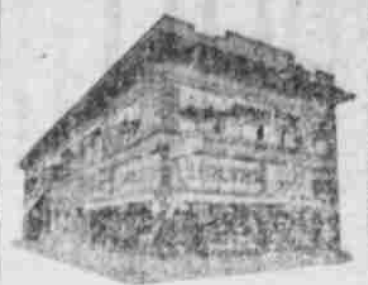

FARMER'S WEEK DEC. 26-31

Farmers week at O. A. C. has been scheduled for December 26-31. Seven winter short courses in latest farm practices developed by the experiment station will run as follows: Two weeks course in fruit and vegetable growing, Dec. 3-17. Four weeks course in beekeeping, Jan. 30-Feb. 25. Four weeks course in grain grading, Jan. 9-21. Eleven weeks course in tractor mechanics, Jan. 2-March 18. Eleven weeks course in dairy manu-

FALL FRESHENING BEST

Fall freshening cows yield from 10 to 20 per cent more milk during the year than those freshening in the spring, and their greatest yield comes at the season when prices are highest, which makes this a profitable dairy practice.

WINTER TREE PLANTING GOOD

Fruit trees may be planted in Western Oregon from now on whenever soil and weather conditions permit. Obtain well matured trees and then prune the roots carefully before setting to make smooth cuts that will callous over quickly.

SMALL HOG HERD BEST

Because of the low price of grain and the strong demand for hogs it is reasonable to expect history to repeat itself—that is, there will be so many sows bred that the supply will exceed the demand in a couple of years. The safe hog production program is one based on a proper balance with other industries on the farm.

SEEKS LOWER FARM COST

Lowering the unit cost of farm production by newer methods of cropping, soil handling and general farm management, is the aim of Farmer's week at O. A. C., December 26-31.
