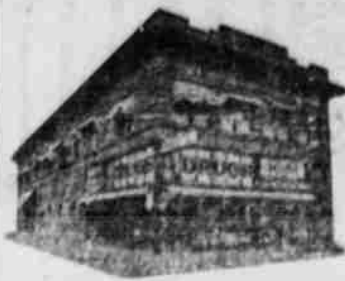

LET'S HEAR FROM THE TOBACCO MANUFACTURERS

The United States forest service issues a report showing that during 1921, one hundred forest fires in Oregon and Washington were due to smokers. Carelessness in throwing away cigar and cigarette stubs while enjoying the benefits of our beautiful forests caused damaging fires and the expenditure of much money in extinguishing them.

A Canadian cigarette manufacturer is helping in the campaign against forest fire destruction by putting a little red printed slip in each cigarette package asking smokers to not throw away lighted matches or cigarettes and to see that the fire in these articles is completely extinguished before disposing of them.

American cigarette manufacturers have been appealed to to follow this example but not a one has shown any inclination to help protect our forests from the ravages which their manufactured product helps bring about.

If our cigarette and cigar manufacturers were awake to the opportunity they would create a lasting friendship for their product by putting a fire warning in each package of their manufactured goods, not only to protect forests but to warn every smoker of the dangers of throwing away a lighted match, cigarette or cigar stub. Destructive fires of many kinds have been caused in this manner.

Let us hear from the tobacco companies who could in this manner be of great assistance towards eliminating the fire hazards which their product now creates. It would cost them the merest fraction of a cent per package to carry out this proposal.
