Brief Digest of an Act Passed by Last Special Session interested.

Providing for the supervision and regulation of the transportation of armons and property for compensation over any public highway by motor

The new automotive legislation is tions, persons or companies owalne. controlling, operating or manusing tess of transportation of persons of property for compensation over the public highways of the state, except. studious ens had been crowded out. ion being made to such vehicles as operate exclusively within the limits switches ready. The public service commission, in its administration of the act, is author lzed to supervise and regulate such ties from the standpoint of their reasonableness, safety and adequacy and to exercise jurisdiction in such matters affecting the relationship of such companies with the passenger and shipping public.

All companies or individuals subject to the act and engaged in the operation of this class of public trans cortation must first obtain from the commission a certificate or permit setting forth the terms and conditions covering such operations, also to file a surety bond or liability insurance and good faith undertaking. The meximum liceuse foe is fixed at ten dollars per vehicle.

The necessary application blanks, including a request for pertinent data. necompenied by cories of the law, are fernished by the public service conmission tromptly upon request. The county clerks and county judges of the various counties have been supplied with copies of the new law for the information of the general public.

The commission requests the cooperation of the automotive industry and the general public in the introduction of and compliance with the new law in matter and spirit.
