No sooner does a deputy sheriff of Pasco, Washington, clear the good name of the rabbits of that vicinity from the charge of chasing coyotes and dogs than a report comes from Rock Island, Illinois, that a rabbit hunter near that city was shot and killed by his own dog. The hunter became displeased with the dog, and poked him with the butt of his shotgun, and the gun was discharged and killed the man. Even if it is proved that the dog discharged the gun, no doubt he would be acquitted on the ground of self-defense.

The reform which Gen. Leonard Wood, as governor general, was expected to bring about in the Philippines are beginning to come into sight. He is trying to induce the Igorrotes to quit eating dog meat, and eat sheep and goat instead. He told a company of Igorrote chiefs, with whom he held a conference, that the eating of dog meat was not an indication of up-to-date culture. ## THE IRISHMAN PROBLEM

It would seem as though almost any experienced and seasoned diplomat, statesman or legislator might before this have devised a settlement of the Irish "situation"; but to settle the Irishman so that he would stay settled until the next time, that is altogether a different question, and one calling for a much higher order of talent. That is a problem that would tax the genius and skill of a Machiavelli.

## LICENSES DELAYED, EXTENSION OF TIME

Marshal Donahill wishes us to pass on, in substance, a statement issued by the secretary of state. So many motor vehicle owners made application for 1922 licenses in the last few days of December that it caused a congestion in the motor vehicle division of the department of state and a delay in the issue of licenses. To offset this, the state inspectors and the local officers whose duty it is to enforce the motor vehicle law will permit the operation of cars on 1921 licenses by all persons who have applied for 1922 licenses until the new licenses are received from the secretary of state.

The state department hopes to be able to forward all 1922 licenses applied for by January 20, and the law will not be enforced against such applicants until after that date.

If the new Irish Free State becomes a happy and harmonious member of the family of nations after twenty years of test we should be in favor of having congress appoint a commission to study it as a model for the
