RED CROSS ROLL CALL WILL START NOVEMBER 11

Judge G. F. Skipworth, will again serve as general chairman for the Sixth annual Red Cross roll call for Lane County from November 11th to November 30th. At this time the people throughout the county will have an opportunity to renew their annual membership in the Red Cross.

J. S. Maglady will serve as chairman for the county outside of Eugene while E. U. Lee will serve as chairman for the city of Eugene. Mr. Maglady has sent letters appointing 65 local chairmen in as many Lane county towns and communities Mr. Lee, a little later will appoint chairmen for the quarter sections, and wards of the city and for the university.
