### THANKSGIVING RATES TO BE GIVEN BY S. P. LINES

Don't eat your Thanksgiving turkey "like mother used to cook it" this year; eat it the way she does, the Southern Pacific will help you. Thanksgiving rates will be given by the company on all its lines where the one-way fare is \$30 or less. The round-trip rate will be one and one-half times the one way fare, or a 25 per cent reduction. Tickets will be on sale November 29 and 30 with final return limit December 4.

Reduced round trip fall excursion fares between various points on its lines in California, which were put into effect by the Southern Pacific company during October and Novem-

ber, will be extended until December 31. It has just been announced at Southern Pacific headquarters.

The reduction in fares under the fall excursion tariffs are 20 per cent from the double one-way fare for tickets sold every day during December with return limit January 31 and 33 and one-third per cent on tickets sold on Fridays and Saturdays of each week with the 15 day return limit. The season tickets allow stopovers while the 15 day tickets do not.

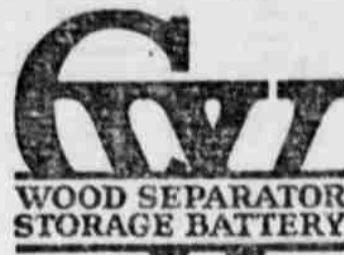
