### NOTICE AGAINST STOCK RUNNING AT LARGE IN WENDLING PRECINCT

It appearing from the abstract of votes cast at the regular November 7th, 1922, election, as made by the official canvassing board of Lane County, Oregon, that at said election the total number of votes cast in Wendling Precinct in Lane County, Oregon, on the question "For and against stock running at large" is and was 169 and of said votes, 99 votes were cast for stock running at large, and 129 votes were cast against stock running at large, and that there was therefore a majority of 109 votes against stock running at large in said precinct.

Notice is hereby given that after sixty days from the date of this notice it shall be unlawful for stock to run at large in said precinct, under penalty of ten (\$10.00) dollars for the first offense, and twenty (\$20.00) for each and every subsequent offense, to be recovered from the owner of the stock in a civil action in the name of the State of Oregon before a justice of the peace of the district in which such owner or keeper or either of them may reside, and if there be no such justice of the peace in such district, then before any justice of the peace in the County, and it shall be the duty of each constable in any justice of the peace district, and of each road supervisor in any road district, to enforce the provisions of this act, and such penalty shall be for the benefit of, and when collected, paid into the common school fund of the County in which such action is brought, within sixty (60) days after such animal is proved to be at large. 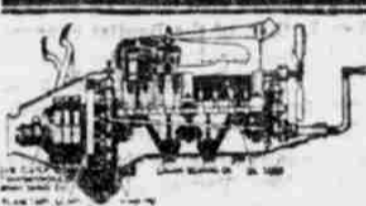
