MILL ROBBED OF \$200 IN GAS BOOKS

Two hundred dollars worth of gasoline coupon books, \$2. in stamps, some non-transferable corporation stock, and two Liberty bonds were taken when burglars rifled the safe of the Springfield Mill and Grain Co. some time Tuesday night. Entrance was made through a west window by removing a pane of glass. Another robbery of the concern was last winter, when thieves blew open the safe, but found nothing of value. "They were gentlemen robbers, however," remarked John Bushman, commenting on the fact that the first ones had left the private papers undisturbed. This time the box containing insurance policies, and other securities and papers of G. G. Bushman, manager, was opened in the street, and papers found next morning after being rained on all night.
