NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION
 Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the Town of Springfield, Oregon, at City Hall on the 17th day of December, 1923, at which special election there will be submitted to the legal voters of said Town for their adoption or rejection said proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council, to-wit:

RESOLUTION

Be it resolved by the common council of the town of Springfield, Lane

County, State of Oregon, that the following proposed amendment to the charter of said town and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of the said town for their adoption or rejection at the special town election to be held on the 17th day of December, 1923, as in this resolution provided, to-wit:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL
 An Act

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Springfield, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts relating to the Incorporation of the Town of Springfield, and all acts amendatory thereof," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 10th, 1893, as amended by all other or subsequent acts of the Legislative assembly or by vote of the people.

Be it enacted by the people of the town of Springfield, Lane County, State of Oregon, that an act entitled, "An act to incorporate the town of Springfield, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts relating to the incorporation of the town of Springfield, and all acts amendatory thereof," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 10th, 1893, and all acts amending said acts adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto Chapter XII, to read as follows:

CHAPTER XII

Section 143 (a) For the purpose of procuring funds in an amount, together with funds in the town treasury applicable to the purpose, sufficient to pay, redeem and retire "Springfield Improvement Bonds," dated April 1, 1914, maturing April 1, 1924, and optional at any semi-annual coupon period on and after one year from date in the principal sum of \$50,132.37, with accrued interest, said bonds being numbered 23 to 123, and in denominations of \$50 each, except No. 123 in the principal sum of \$132.37, each and all of which said bonds are hereby expressly validated, the Council of the Town of Springfield is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said town in the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), said bonds to be in denominations of \$500 or \$1000 each, to bear such date or dates as the Council may determine, and to mature in twenty years from date, said bonds to be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder under the corporate seal of said town, and to bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, said interest being represented by interest coupons thereto attached bearing the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and recorder, whereby the Town of Springfield shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay to the bearer of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value together with interest thereon in like gold coin as herein above provided, said bonds to be a direct general obligation of said town, and to be known as "Town of Springfield Refunding General Obligation Bonds," principal and interest of said bonds to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.

(b) The purchaser of said bonds shall in no way be required to see to the proper application of the purchase money therefor.

(c) The debt limitations contained in the charter of said town shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

(d) The Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for town purposes, include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest on outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

(e) The Council is authorized and empowered to sell said bonds for the best price obtainable, provided that in the event said bonds are sold for

less than par, the money necessary to refund the bonds hereinabove provided for shall be paid out of the general fund, but in the event said bonds are sold at a premium, the amount thereof shall be paid into the general fund.

RESOLVED FURTHER That for the hereinabove proposed charter amendments, the following ballot title be and the same is adopted, to-wit: **CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL**
 An Act

To amend the charter of the Town of Springfield, filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 10, 1893, and to amend all subsequent amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people by adding Chapter XII, authorizing the issuance and sale of \$50,000 bonds of said town to refund Improvement Bonds maturing April 1, 1924, providing for levy of a special tax to pay principal thereof and

interest thereon.

RESOLVER FURTHER That this resolution for the proposed charter amendment submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of the Town of Springfield for submission to the legal voters of the said town at a special election which shall and hereby is called to be held on the 17th day of December, 1923, during the legal voting hours on said date.

RESOLVED FURTHER That the City Hall in said town is hereby designated as the polling place for said special election, and C. E. Wheaton, Frank Gordon and Baxter Young as clerks therefor, and Vina McLean and Rosa Montgomery as the clerks therefor.

RESOLVED FURTHER That the Recorder be and is hereby instructed and required to publish the herein above proposed charter amendment submitted to the legal voters by the

Council in the manner required by law; that is to say, by publication of this resolution in full in the Springfield News, a newspaper published in the town of Springfield, for two consecutive publications within the fifteen days immediately preceding the special election, and also to post a copy of the said resolutions in three public places at least ten (10) days before the date of said election. Adopted by the Council of the Town of Springfield on the 26th day of November, 1923, by the following vote:
