

MANY HUNTING LICENSE FEES COLLECTED IN 1923

Hunting and fishing license fees collected at the office of the county clerk this year totaled \$1,879.15, according to a compilation made by Mrs. R. S. Bryson this morning. May, when fishermen take to the streams in great numbers, was the heavy month in license sales, \$370.50 being taken in then. September, when deer hunters take the field, is next with \$328.40.

One hundred seventy hunters' licenses were sold at \$3 each. Twenty county hunters' licenses, for boys between 14 and 18 years of age, were sold for \$1.50 each. Five non-residents took out hunting licenses at \$10 each.

The 164 anglers' licenses sold during the year brought \$3 each, 20 county anglers' licenses, \$1.50 each, and nine non-residents' anglers' licenses brought varying amounts. Non-resident sportsmen are charged the same sum that an Oregon sportsman would be charged in their state.

Combination licenses to the number of 154 were disposed of.

SPRINGFIELD GIRL WILL GRADUATE AT UNIVERSITY

University of Oregon, Eugene, Dec. 20.—(Special.)—Maud F. Gorrie of Springfield is one of the 28 persons who will receive a degree from the University of Oregon in January, 1924. She will receive a B. A. degree from the department of botany and bacteriology.

Of the 28 degrees to be granted, five will be given by the school of education, seven by the school of business administration, three by the department of botany and bacteriology, three by the department of English literature, two by the department of economics and one each by the following schools and departments: music, philosophy, history, psychology, fine arts, chemistry, medicine and physical education.

There are now 41 students registered at the University who will receive degrees upon completion of this term's work.

Ada M. Vinyard was given a divorce from Walter S. Vinyard on grounds of desertion. The couple was married in Albany September 30, 1918. R. R. Chase was granted a decree from Myrtice A. Chase on grounds of desertion. The couple was married in Roseburg June 26, 1922.

WHAT BECOMES OF THE LICENSE FEES?

Forty-eight states collected \$152,367,023 in 1922 as receipts from automobile license fees. The cost of collection, the cost of the plates themselves, and other expenses was less than four million dollars, so that a total of \$148,750.00 was left as the net profits to be spent on highways.

This sum is divided into appropriations for State highway departments, 16 millions; Federal aid funds, 34 millions; maintenance of Federal aid roads, 32 millions; construction of other than Federal aid roads, 6 1/2 millions; maintenance of other than Federal aid roads, 21 1/2 millions; and given as aid to counties, 25 1/2 millions. New Hampshire collects the largest revenue per individual car or truck, getting an average of \$25.73 each, while Arizona is easiest upon car owners from the license standpoint obtaining but \$5.69 each.

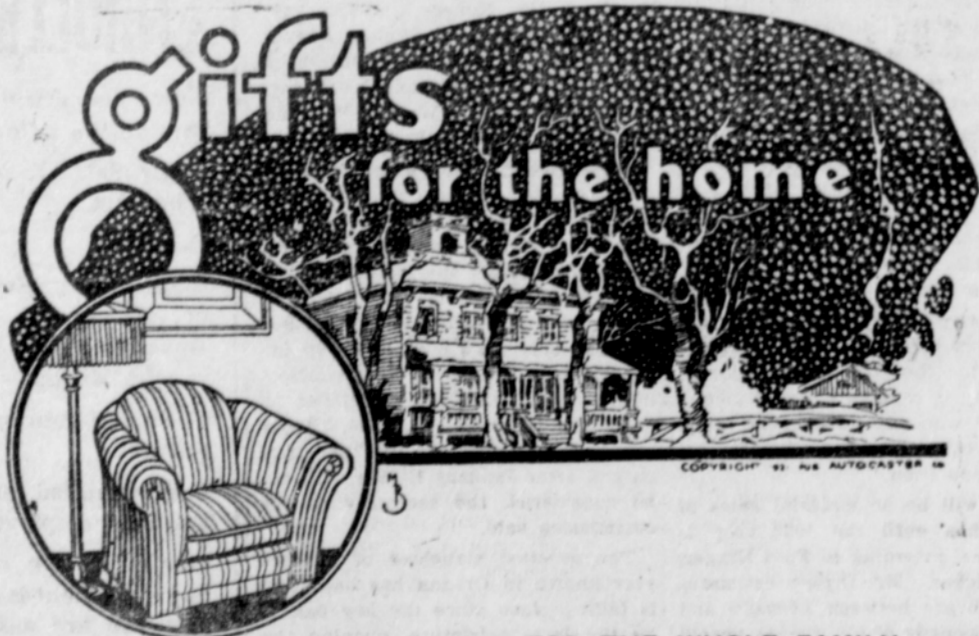
