week, returning to her home Saturday.

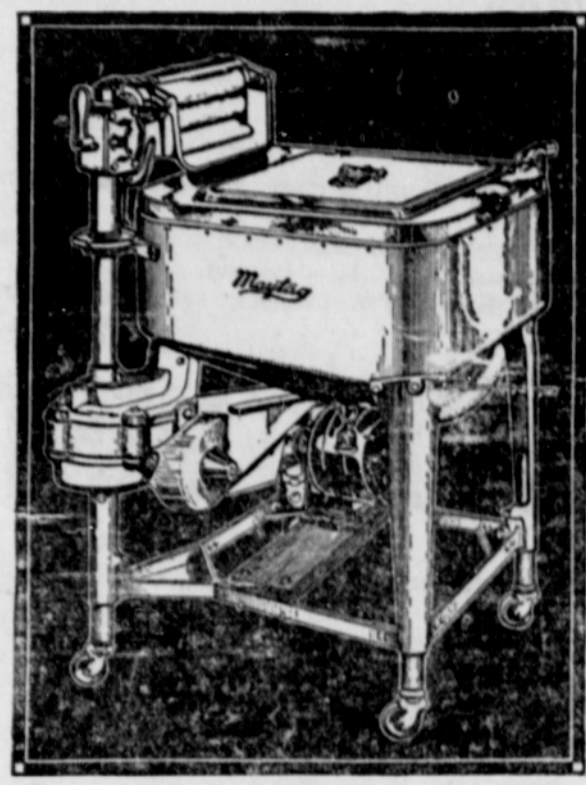
