NEW POSTAL RATES WILL CAUSE MANY CHANGES

New postal rates affecting newspapers, money orders, insurance, registry fees, and some first class matter will go into effect next Wednesday, April 15.

Insured packages will be at the rate of value of 5 cents for \$5; 8 cents for \$25; 10 cents for \$50; 15c for \$100.

New money order rates are as follows:

\$2.50, 5c; \$2.50 and not over \$5, 7c; \$5.00 and not over \$10, 10c; \$10 and not over \$20, 12c; \$20 and not over \$40, 15c; \$40 and not over \$60, 18c; \$60 and not over \$80, 20c; \$80 and not over \$100, 22c.

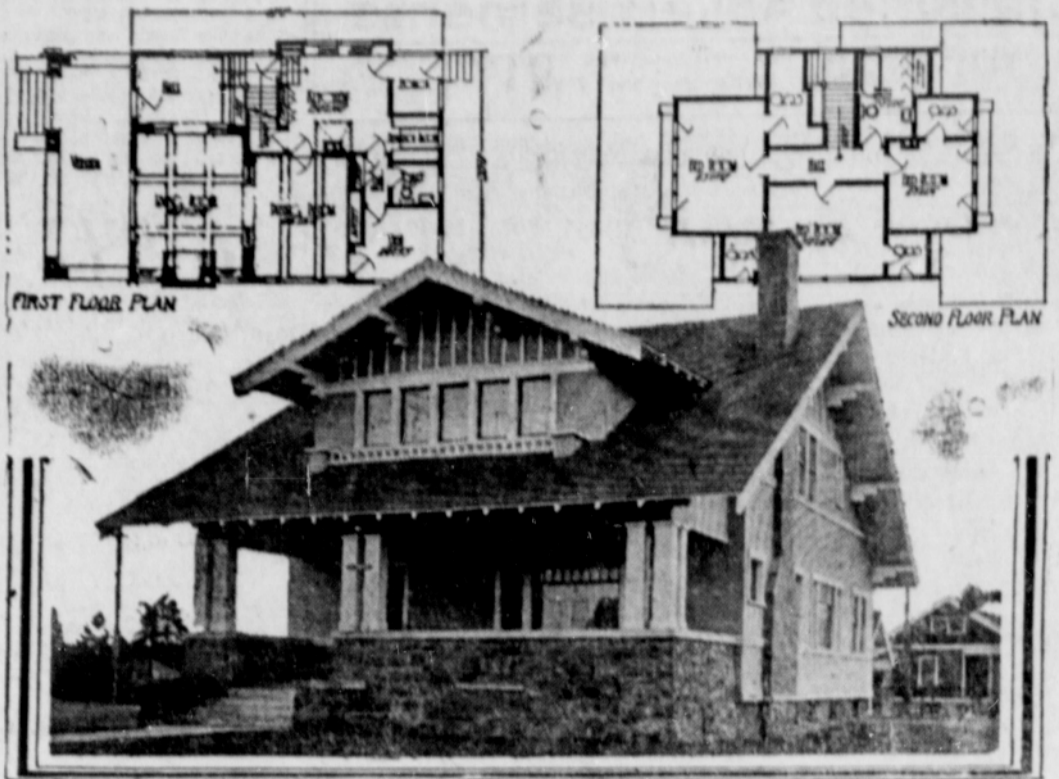

ANNUAL Clean-up Week April 15 to 18

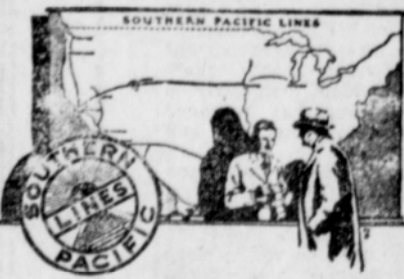
The town council has set aside these days for the FREE COLLECTION
