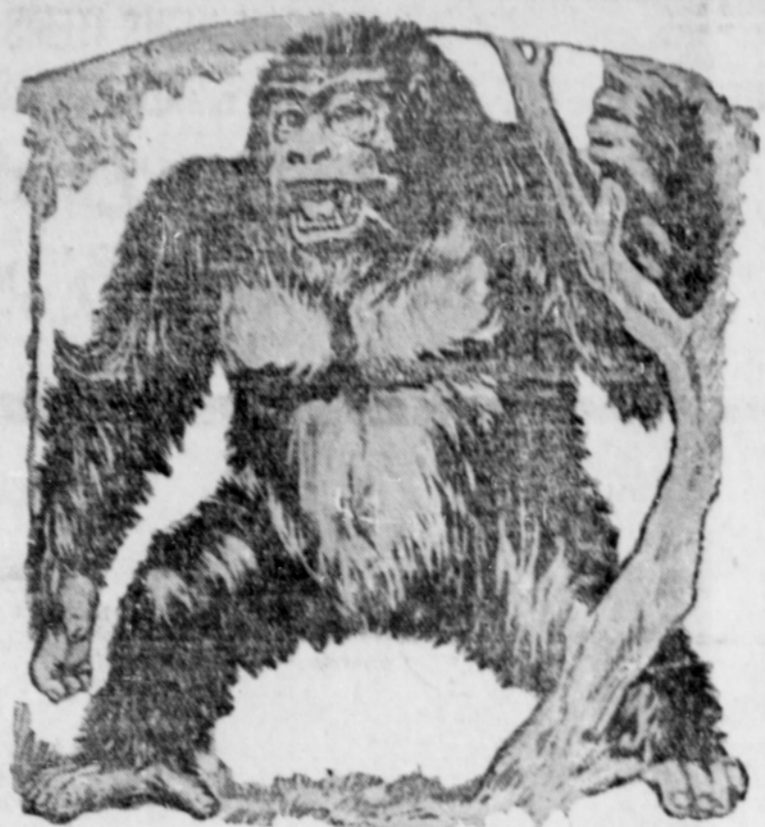
The shortest route to misery, experience proves to me—is to monkey with conditions that's as good as they can be.



## LOWELL THEATER WILL OPEN SOON

Eugene's new Lowell theater, at Tenth avenue and Willamette street, will be formally opened the week of May 4, it was announced today by Don McDonald, manager. The announcement came as somewhat of a surprise, since it was generally expected that a longer time would be required to complete construction. Work is being speeded, however, in order to allow for the grand opening during the week announced.

The theater, with its main lobby on Willamette street, is Romanesque-Byzantine in architecture, the rounded arches and massive construction giv-

ing it this classification.

**Foyer is Charming**

The heavily carpeted foyer is a thing of real architectural beauty. Specially designed iron chairs, console table, and tapestry and mirror on the end wall, add to the charm.

A double ramp from the foyer to the balcony is one of the prettiest in design and workmanship o the coast. Five arches divide the ramp, and through the arches may be seen the five massive paintings on the ramp walls, leading to the second landing.

A luxuriously furnished ladies rest room will be off the second landing of the ramp on the west side, with the men's smoking room off the opposite landing on the east side.

The balcony entrance is from the ramp in the foyer. Grilled openings on the way up give a view of the foyer from above. The balcony will seat as many as the ower floor, with the same perfect vision provided.

The organ is a specially designed Wuritzer three-manuel affair, nearly twice as large as the big Wuritzer in the Rex theater. hTe organ chambers are on either side of the stage.

the music coming through the grilles and blending in the center, with an entirely different effect that is not given by the ordinary organ. The three-manual console is in the center of the pit in front of the stage. hTe pit is large enough to seat a large orchestra.
