FIR LOGGING CAMPS CLOSE; PINE IS BUSY

Portland, May, 14.—(Special)—Fir logging on the west coast underwent further curtailment last week when several large camps were entirely closed and fallers and buckers laid off at others, according to reports from various 4L employment service offices received at 4L headquarters here today. The curtailment of log production is at present more marked in the Puget Sound and Grays Harbor districts than it is elsewhere.

Logging and sawmilling in the pine districts of Eastern Washington, Oregon and Idaho, are at seasonal height, the reports show, and practically all lumber operations there are busy. Condensed reports from the various 4L offices are as follows:

Portland—There is no sign of a let up in logging activity along the Columbia river. Practically all camps in this district are operating with full crews. Labor turnovers continue extremely heavy. Operating schedules of local mills remain the same as for many weeks past. The former Cameron sawmill at Goldendale, Wn., down for the past year, will start cutting again this week under new management. Street paving and other municipal work here has been increased. Calls for farm and dairy help lead all demand for labor.

Aberdeen—Falling and bucking operations have been stopped at several mire camps in Grays Harbor district. There has been no change in time of local sawmills. County and City street and road work has absorbed practically all the surplus of common labor that was brought about two weeks ago when five large logging camps ceased operations. Unemployed experienced loggers appear to have left Grays Harbor in search of work elsewhere and there are very few men out of work either in Hoquiam or Aberdeen.

Tacoma—Labor turnover in camps and sawmills of this district last week showed a heavy increase. Nearly all of the local mills are continuing the five-day week. There are almost no skilled workers out of employment here, but there is still a surplus of common labor.

Seattle—Loggin on Puget Sound was further curtailed last week when the Siuslaw, Carsborz, Cavario and Puget Sound Mills & Timber companies' camps were closed down. Fallers and buckers have been laid off at the Westfork Logging Co.'s camp. Sawmills of this district are, for the most part continuing the five day week. Another large fishing crew went north last week. Added street repairs in Seattle have required a lot of extra help. House building is active. There are few skilled men of any description now unemployed.

Spokane—Railroad section and grading work in this district last week required more additional help than did any industry. State road building in Northern Idaho also is getting started; the state's program calls for 100 miles of new highways this year. Practically all sawmills are now running. Men more than usual are hiring direct on the job and they are working more steadily. Labor turnover in most industries is very light.
