It was decided to order "No Trespassing" signs to be put up on the ranches of those joining the Association. A committee consisting of C. F. Hyde, C. L. Williams, and W. L. Bristow were appointed to attend to this. A committee consisting of Sellers, Morningstar, Olson, Callison, Bennett, Carothers, Lawson, Kabler and H. C. Wheeler was appointed to see Sheriff Taylor and ask the support of his office, and to make arrangements with District Attorney Medley to give a talk on the laws covering such protective measures.

A committee consisting of E. B. Tinker, Jesse Phelps and Earnest Schrenk was appointed to draw up a constitution and by laws. The committee appointer are to report to the chairman and another meeting of the association to be held as soon as possible. Everyone wishing to join this association will be welcomed.

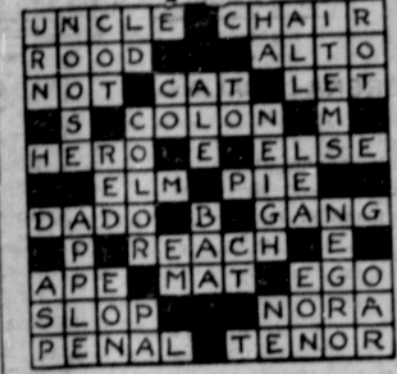


