Oregon brought the total of its surfaced roads under state highway supervision up to 3014 miles at the end of 1924, having surfaced or built up to grade 389 miles during the year, the bureau of roads has announced. As the total mileage of the state highway system is 4339.7, there remain to be completed by surfacing 1325 miles.

The public service commission has rescinded an order issued recently suspending indefinitely the new tariff filed by the Amity Mutual Telephone company. As a result of the order issued by the commission the new rates adopted by the telephone company will become effective immediate-

Persons affected by a law enacted at a recent session of the legislature providing that penalties, interest and costs accruing on taxes levied for the years 1921, 1922 and 1923, shall be remitted, may recover such penalty, interest and costs provided they were paid through error after the act became effective.
