W. P. Erhart, operator of a shingle prominent citizen of Baker, died at mill at Canary, in the western end of Lane county, has just purchased from the government through the forest service 1,800,000 feet of dead cedar timber at \$1.50 a thousand feet.

Construction of new buildings in Bend reached its peak for the year in September, and doubled the mark for the same month in 1924. Permits were granted for buildings, aggregate cost of which will be \$53,005.

Lumber shipments from the Columbia river for the past month totaled 36,394,000 feet. Salmon shipments for September totaled 93,062 cases and cereal shipments 193,660 bushels of wheat and 24,873 barrels of flour.

Twelve hundred acres of land in the fumalo project near Bend have been sold, contracted for or an agreement intered into whereby taxes were paid luring the past few days, as a result of a publicity campaign which has peen conducted.

The Umpqua Mills & Timber company, recently organized with a capial of \$1,500,000 has acquired approxi nately 350,000,000 feet of standing timper adjacent to tidewater on Smith iver in Douglas county. The timper was formerly owned by the Coos Bay Lumber company.
