

## PUBLIC MARKET

Ordinance No. 491.

An Ordinance to provide for the establishment and control of a public market in the Town of Springfield, providing penalties for the violation of the same and declaring an emergency.

THE TOWN OF SPRINGFIELD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby created and established in the Town of Springfield a public market to be known as the "Producers' Public Market" located on the pavement on the south line of Main street in the Town of Springfield.

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of the ordinance and all ordinances of the Town of Springfield, the said public market shall be under the charge and control of a market committee composed of five people to be selected as herein provided for. Two people to be appointed by the Springfield Lions club, two by the Lane County Farmers' Union and one by the Mayor of the Town of Springfield and the appointment of all to be ratified by the common council of the Town of Springfield. Terms of office of the members of the market committee shall commence on the first day of October of each year beginning in 1925. If either or both the Springfield Lions club or the Lane County Farmers' union shall fail to appoint or certify to the mayor of the town of Springfield the members herein provided for then the mayor shall submit the names of people appointed by himself as members of the market committee herein provided for to the common council at the first meeting in October of each year. Said members of the market committee shall serve for one year and shall not be removed from office except for cause deemed to be the best interest of the said Producers' Public Market and then only on a two-thirds vote of the common council and the approval of the mayor.

Section 3. The Producers' Public Market shall be open for purpose of displaying and setting products (1) of producers, and (2) associations of producers.

Producers within the meaning of this ordinance shall mean persons who raise their own products upon land owned or leased by them, and in all cases where meat or fowls are displayed, offered for sale or sold, at said public market, the term producer shall mean persons who have had the animals or fowls in their possession and have fed the same for a period of at least 90 days before the same are slaughtered or offered for sale.

Associations of producers shall mean associations composed of bona fide producers as above named.

Producers of associations may sell by agents, provided the agent is paid on a flat salary basis and not on commission.

It shall be unlawful for any producer by himself or agent to offer for sale at said market any produce not produced upon either land owned or leased by himself.

It shall be unlawful for any person to display or offer for sale or sell at said public market any produce purchased directly or indirectly from any other person or offer for sale or sell in said public market any produce of any kind contrary to the provisions of this ordinance.

It shall be unlawful for any producers' agent to offer for sale or sell at public market any produce which is not grown upon the land owned or leased by the producer he represents.

It shall be unlawful for any agent, manager or any other person representing an association to offer for sale, sell or display in public market any produce which is not grown upon the land owned or leased by a bona fide member of the association.

It shall be unlawful to offer for sale any manufactured or prepared article in said public market unless the main ingredient of said article has been produced upon land owned or leased by the producer or bona fide member of the association offering for sale or selling the article.

It shall be unlawful for any person to use any deceit, imposition or misrepresentation in selling or attempting to sell any article at said public market.

Section 4. Any person or association desiring to sell products in said public market shall satisfy the Market Master that he or it is entitled to the privileges of said market as above provided and the Market Master in his discretion may require proof by affidavit of the facts which entitles such person or association to the privileges of said market.

Agents shall submit to the Market Master proper evidence in writing of their agency and shall keep a full and complete record of the produce received by them at said public mar-

ket, which record shall be open at all times to the inspection of the Market Master.

Section 5. Spaces of convenient size shall be allotted in the manner hereinafter provided, and no person or producer shall sell, or offer for sale, any article of produce or article allotted to be sold in said market in any other space than in the space regularly allotted to such person or producer for that purpose; provided further, that reasonable ingress be allotted to property owners along said street for the necessary loading or unloading of vehicles in a prompt and reasonable manner, and that a passage way shall be left in the middle of said street sufficient for the purpose of traffic in one direction.

Section 6. A charge of twenty-five cents per day shall be collected by the Market Master from each producer for each space or stall, and an additional charge of 25 cents per day shall be collected from each producer for each extra sales person in each such space or stall; provided, however, that no extra charge shall be made for the husband, wife son or daughter of the producer acting as a sales person. A charge of 50 cents per day shall be collected from each association for the use of such space or stall allotted to it. Stalls space may be reserved for a period not to exceed the last day of the current month by paying rent in advance for at least three days of each week of said period.

Section 7. The said Market Committee shall appoint a Market Master and neede assistants and the Market Master's appointment shall be before becoming effective be confirmed or approved by the Common Council of the Town of Springfield by a majority of all members voting the affirmative on such question. Said Market Master and his assistants shall receive salaries or compensation as said Market Committee shall determine and shall have direct management and control of the said Producers' Public Market, subject to the ordinances of the Town of Springfield, and it shall be their duty to enforce all ordinances, rules and regulations of the Town of Springfield relating to said public market and the Market Master or his assistants shall be on duty every day the market is open.

Section 8. Rules and regulations governing the conduct and control of said public market shall be as follows:

Rule 1. The market may be open each day in the week except Sunday at the discretion of the Market Master from 7 o'clock A. M. to 6 o'clock P. M. No produce may be sold or displayed later than 15 minutes after closing time.

Rule 2. Space in said market shall not be allotted to an applicant therefor until proper proof has been submitted to the Market Master of his eligibility.

Rule 3. Producers shall remove all horses and other animals, and all vehicles from the market street at once after unloading.

Rule 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to make any public outcry or do hawking or "Spilling" or to give any musical or other entertainment for the purpose of drawing custom or to attract attention to any market place.

Rule 5. Vendors may place signs over their booths, tables or stalls, subject to the approval of the Market Master.

Rule 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to fail to promptly vacate the stand assigned to him upon the order to do so by the Market Master.

Rule 7. No person shall be allowed more than one booth or stall, nor shall he sell through more than one employe, except with the consent and approval of the Market Master.

Rule 8. The occupants of all stalls shall keep the same in a clean and sanitary condition, shall not permit the accumulation of filth or rubbish or any other offensive matter, whatever, and rubbish shall be removed before leaving the stalls. No produce shall be allowed upon the pavement.

Rule 9. A price card must be posted in a conspicuous place on all goods offered for sale.

Rule 10. All poultry must have attached thereto a card giving the name and address of the seller. Poultry fed immediately prior to killing will not be permitted to be sold in the said market.

Rule 11. All eggs must bear the name of the producer either upon the egg itself or upon the carton in which they are sold. (Storage eggs must be plainly marked "Storage" and sold as such.)

Rule 12. All goods offered for sale by weight must be weighed in plain view of the purchaser.

Rule 13. No person shall sell or offer for sale any diseased or spoiled produce, or any article of produce not fit for human food.

Rule 14. Smoking or profane, abu-

Use of discourteous language in the stalls is prohibited.

Rule 15. No person shall slaughter or dress any animal or fowl within the market spaces, or throw or deposit any animal or vegetable matter, bones, offal, filth, rubbish or any other offensive or dirty matter of any kind of obstruction therein.

Rule 16. Flowers, bulbs, shrubs, potted plants and nursery stock may be sold on days fixed by the Market Master.

Rule 17. If any person shall offer for sale or sell any produce in said public market at a price higher than the prevailing market price, it shall be the duty of the Market Master to give notice to such person of the prevailing market price and after said notice said person shall be prohibited from selling said produce at a higher price than the said prevailing market price.

Section 9. It shall be unlawful for any person to place, set up, keep or maintain any booth, stand, table, box, board, shelf or other object for the purpose of selling or offering for sale therefrom any article or thing in the street, avenues, alleys or public places, except such portions of

streets or public places as shall have been by ordinance established and designated as market places.

Section 10. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or rule herein prescribed shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment in the city jail for not more than sixty days.

Section 11. Any person who has violated or shall hereafter violate any provision or rule contained in this ordinance may be suspended or excluded by the Market Master from selling or offering for sale any produce in any public market in the town of Springfield. Provided, however, any person so expelled shall have the right at any time to petition the common council for reinstatement and upon consideration of the petition the council shall either grant or refuse said petition.

Section 12. The Town of Springfield shall in no event and under no circumstances be liable for any salaries, compensation for labor or damages of any kind or character to any person, firm or corporation caused by

reason of said public market but all liability or responsibility is assumed by the said market committee.

Section 13. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety for the same, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and is hereby declared this ordinance shall go into effect and force from and after its passage by the council.

A new set of office furniture was installed in the offices of Dr. Eugene Kester this week.

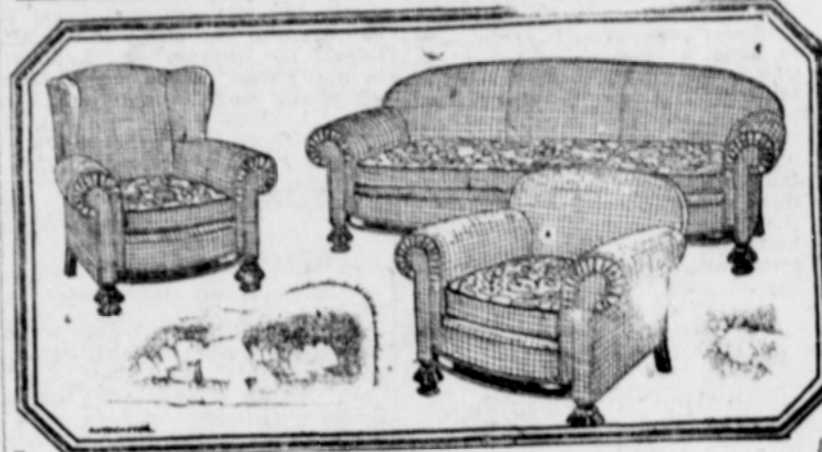
### LIBRARY BOARD ORDERS MAGAZINE LIST FOR 1926
