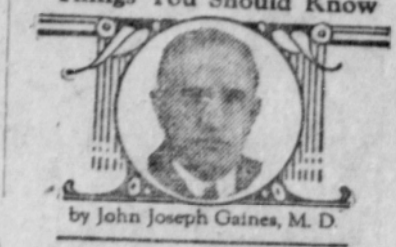

About Your Health



Things You Should Know

Alleviating Bronchial Distress
"Winter Bronchitis" is a real affliction, peculiar to those already aged or approaching old age. It is a very common complaint, as every practicing physician knows. Its cure becomes a problem for many families with numberless old folks among their members. To old people, the discomforts are paramount blessings. Cough mixtures are legion, and many are palliative but seldom curative. Indeed, proper conduct does more permanent good than medicine. The "fresh air crank" comes in and demands the inevitable wide-open windows. No matter how cold—how damp—or how laden with floating gases and micro-organisms, the windows must be open, and the cough goes on, to the distress of the sufferer and of those about him. To stupefy such patients with narcotic cough mixtures is the general rule, but how futile!

Remember this: Warm air may be just as pure as cold, and is usually much more comforting than cold night air. Persons should invariably be "aired out" thoroughly during the day. Beds are much healthier un-made, and allowed to air thoroughly. When night comes close the windows, and allow as little change of temperature as possible in the bedroom till morning. Do not close bedroom doors if the sleeping apartment is small and this suggests airing the entire residence as often as necessary for pure air, but do it in daytime. Sleeping-rooms should be where bright sunlight can enter freely during the day. And, remember this: Cold night-air never benefitted a cough—on the contrary, it aggravates and prolongs the difficulty. Night-airs are laden with impurities, and, in winter, chill the delicate respiratory membranes, beyond their recuperative power. The closed bedroom is not an "old foggy" idea.

INFLUX OF MEN TO COAST REGION CONTINUES

Portland, Nov. 19.—(Special).—Although the number of men at present employed in Pacific slope industries is no less than it was one week ago, the steady influx of workers from other districts is gradually bringing about a condition of apparent acute unemployment, according to reports from 4L employment service offices in various northwestern cities received at 4L headquarters here. Fir logging and lumbering are fully as active as they were last year at this time, the reports indicate, and general construction work has been in even greater volume.

Employment and industrial conditions in various Pacific Northwest districts were reported as follows:

Portland—Camps and mills in this district continue active. The number of unemployed men increasing daily.

Raymon—South Bond, Wn.—Highway work completed, Sawmills active. More men than jobs here.

Aberdeen—Hoquiam, Wn.—Logging and sawmilling virtually at 100 per cent capacity. Few unemployed here.

Tacoma—Jobs offered fewest in many months. Skilled help well employed. Surplus of common labor from outside districts.

Seattle—Surplus of all kinds of help. Logging and sawmill operation in all Puget Sound districts very active.

Spokane—Almost no jobs being offered. Planers operating but part-time. Many sawmills closed for season. More men than jobs.

Hops Go East.

A carload of hops from the Jim Seavey crop was shipped Monday to Illinois by Southern Pacific. Another carload will leave the local warehouse for eastern points Saturday, Agent Carl Olsen said.
