S. P. ACTIVITIES REVIEWED BY PRESIDENT SPROULE

Southern Pacific's capacity for service to the public will be still greater in 1926, according to a New Year's message to the company's employees appearing in the "Southern Pacific Bulletin," the employees' magazine, issued today. The message, in part, is as follows:

"In 1926 our new line connecting California with Oregon through Klamath Falls and the Cascade mountains will be completed.

"In 1926 our new main line in Arizona through Phoenix, the capital of that state, will be completed.

"In 1925 our double track over the Sierra Nevada mountains has been completed and the Lake Tahoe route is thus ready to handle a greater volume of business; in fact, can handle all the business we can provide for it.

"Thus the Pacific lines, under Paul Shoup enter into a new period of activity.

"Our Texas and Louisiana lines, under Mr. Scott, have been expanded during 1925 by lease of the San Antonio & Arkansas Pass railway and the addition of other mileage, and all of those properties are in better condition than at any time in their history for handling the business. Our steamship lines, under Mr. Spence, are giving better service than ever.

"These are merely outstanding items in the growth, by extension and improvements, of these properties which, combined with rolling stock and motive power of the first class, make ours one of the great transportation systems of the world, placed at the service of the public in full expectation of profitable operation. The company is organized to gather in the business and obtain from it fair returns for transportation of persons and property on the one hand, and, on the other hand, to see that the carriage of them is done with economy and ability in order to produce the net earnings required for the successful conduct of the business. For success, we must handle traffic in greater and increasing volume, and to that end your efforts are enlisted in every part of the service, for all can help to this purpose in the interest of all.

"New money is put into any business for the purpose of earning more money, which can be done in ours by united efforts of all in capturing the business, handling it capably with profit to the company, and with public goodwill."

MANY STUDENTS FAIL AT UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

University of Oregon, Eugene, Jan. 7.—(Special.)—Twice as many students were dropped from the university for poor scholarship in the fall term than ever before, according to an announcement by the registrar today.

Ninety-six students were flunked out at the end of the fall term. Seventy-five of this number were men and 21 were women.

The quality of students, according to the registrar, especially freshmen is probably higher this year, but the reason for the greater number of flunkers is that requirements for staying in the university are stricter than ever before.

Only 26 of those who failed were freshmen. In the first year class only 27.9 per cent failed, whereas 35.6 per cent of the other three classes failed. This indicates, the registrar announced, that the university is not unduly strict with freshmen. Requirements are not quite so high for them, and also they are serious and not so often over-confident. Freshmen must pass approximately one-third of the average number of hours, while members of the other classes must pass nearly half.

In addition to the 96 who failed out entirely, 120 others were placed on probation. Last year 110 were put on probation. Of the probationers 94 are men and 34 women. A majority of those on probation, however, are freshmen.

Twenty-two per cent of students from other states flunked or were put on probation, the registrar stated, while only 61.3 per cent of the Oregonians flunked or were among the probationers.

The total mortality during the fall term was 194, as 98 students withdrew. Difficulty with scholarship is the most common cause of withdrawal.
