Governor Pierce signed an order authorizing a special election February known as the Siskiyou improvement district in southern Oregon. The district would include the western half of Jackson county and the eastern part of Josephine county. The purpose of the district is to construct a road up Williams creek to the Oregon caves. Such a road would cost approximately \$150,000 and would provide an entrance to the caves from the Medford side. The election was authorized under an act of the 1921 legislature.
