No income tax returns are required to be filed by individuals covering the year 1925, except as follows:

Where an individual was married and living with his wife, and their com bined net income was \$3,500 or more; Where an individual was single and his net income was \$1.500 or more:

Where an individual claims exemption as "head of a family," and h.

her net income was \$1,500 or more; Where an individual, married or single, had a gross income of \$5,000 or more, regarless of the amount of the net income.

Gross income, in the case of the purchase and sale of merchandise, means gross sales less the cost of goods sold.
