LIFE OF BANKS READS LIKE WESTERN THRILLER

Drawing from a storehouse of 70 years' experience, Dr. Lewis Albert Banks, who for two weeks conducted evangelistic meetings at the Methodist church, concluded his work here Monday evening, when he told of the pathos, romance, adventure and amusements of a minister's life.

From the time when as a boy of 16 he delivered his first sermon of eight minutes up to the time he reached the pastorate of the largest church in Methodism, the story of Dr. Banks' life reads like a western thriller.

In Vancouver, Wash., where he was pastor of a church and editor of the Pacific Censor, the first prohibition paper west of the Rocky mountains, Dr. Banks was shot by a man who objected to the sentiments expressed in the paper. In Seattle during the anti-Chinese riots a scaffold was erected on which to hang him and several other men who had advocated protection for the Chinese. As a deputy sheriff with 250 others called to quell such a riot Dr. Banks for two and a half hours was covered by three men who spent the time telling him how and where they would shoot him when the order to fire came.

During the old days as a circuit rider he covered all this and surrounding territory, preaching in saloons, in school houses, wherever people gathered.

For several months he occupied the front page of six of Boston's daily papers when he was covering the sweat shop evil in that city.

From the achievements of such a life, Dr. Banks looked back and said, "Happiness is not to be found in great achievements, in the paucity of the multitude, in riches, in glory, nor in fame, but in the simple things of life—in friendships and the love of one's dear ones—Cottage Grove Sentinel.

WHO MUST MAKE OUT INCOME TAX STATEMENTS

Portland, Or., Feb. 22.—Many taxpayers apparently are confused as to the provisions of the new federal income tax law as to their liability for filing returns of income for the year 1925. In view of this fact, Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, today issued the following instructions for the guidance of taxpayers in determining whether or not it will be necessary for them to file returns on or before March 15:

No income tax returns are required to be filed by individuals covering the year 1925, except as follows:

Where an individual was married and living with his wife, and their combined net income was \$3,500 or more;

Where an individual was single and his net income was \$1,500 or more;

Where an individual claims exemption as "head of a family," and his net income was \$1,500 or more;

Where an individual, married or single, had a gross income of \$5,000 or more, regardless of the amount of the net income.

Gross income, in the case of the purchase and sale of merchandise, means gross sales less the cost of goods sold.

Where an individual was married at the beginning of the year and was unmarried during any portion of the year, or vice versa, the exemptions above mentioned are to be apportioned according to the changed status during the year, fractions of months being disregarded.

Blanks have been forwarded to all individuals who filed returns for the year 1924 on the basis of the \$1,000 and \$2,500 exemptions, which applied to that year, but if the net income for the year 1925 does not exceed the amounts above stated, \$1,500 and \$3,500, respectively, it will not be necessary to complete or file returns for the year 1925.
