JAIL UNTENANTED SINCE THANKSGIVING OF 1925

A lonely place is the Springfield city jail, which has been untenanted except for one or two chill-fearing tramps since Thanksgiving time, 1925. Not only has the jail been without a prisoner for three months, but not once during the past year has a man been sentenced to serve in the Springfield hoosegow and jail expense has been practically nothing.

All of which Justice of the Peace R. W. Smith points to as an indication of a lack of crime in the Springfield district. Justice and police court cases have been at a minimum, and most of those called have been in connection with traffic violations by careless but well-meaning citizens.

Inasmuch as all who have been incarcerated in the jail have been liberated before meal time, the jail has been of no expense to the city from the standpoint of prisoners' feed. One or two prisoners, stuporified by over-doses of booze or other intoxicant, have tried their strength on the jail door, resulting in damage which has cost \$4 or \$5 to repair. Such has been the only jail expense.
