

MRS. JOHN HILLS DIES UNDER HOOFS OF COW

Falling under the hoofs of a cow which she was starting to milk, Mrs. John A. Hills, of Lowell, was instantly killed at the barn on the Hills ranch last Friday night.

Mrs. Hills was alone at the time. It was believed that she either slipped and fell or fainted, under the hoofs of the animal, and a broken rib penetrated the heart.

Mrs. Hills was born April 1, 1881. She was the mother of a son, Virgil, and two daughters, Irene and Vida. She is survived also by her mother, Mrs. Nellie Tilton of Dexter; two sisters, Mrs. Lena Graves of New Jersey, and Mrs. Vina Higgins of Trent, Oregon; and two brothers, E. C. Tilton of Dexter and Earl of Trent.

Funeral services were held at the Walker parlor here, Sunday, and the burial was at Natron.

AARON POLLEY, MINER OF OLD WEST, PASSES AWAY

One of the last of the miners of the old west passed Friday when Aaron S. Polley died at the Leaburg home of his niece Mrs. Clara Farnum, at the age of 93 years, 11 months and 24 days.

Leaving New York state when he was 20 years old, Mr. Polley took part in the famous California gold rush, and was in the rush of pioneer mining activity in the old west for more than two score years. He worked in the placer fields and hard rock mines of California and Utah until 18 years ago, when, more than 70 years old, he came to live with his niece at Leaburg.

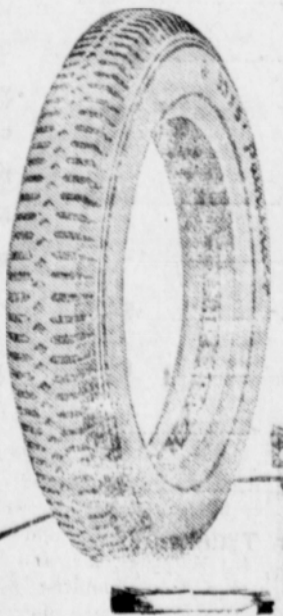
