**BAKER COWS TEST HIGH NATIONAL CLUB REPORTS**

Walter L. and Mabel K. Baker of Canary, Oregon, have just tested the young Jersey cow Rosaire's Koffee 2d with the result that this heifer has made such a good record that she has received recognition from the American Jersey Cattle club.

Rosaire's Koffee 2d was started on test at the early age of one year and ten months and in the ensuing 305 days she yielded 444.84 lbs. of fat and 8478 lbs. of milk averaging 6.25 per cent fat. She met the calving requirements of class AAA, thus qualifying for a silver medal.

Rosaire's Koffee 2d is by Waltz's St. Mawes Chimes, a grandson of the gold and silver medal sire Silver

Chimes of S. B. and Poppy's St. Mawes. The dam of the new medal winner is Rosaire's Koffee, which has a record of 862 pounds of fat. Rosaire's Koffee is a daughter of the gold and silver medal bull, Rosaire's Olga Lad.

**Oregon Heifer is Heavy Producer.**

Violet's St. Mawes Gypsy, a heifer in the Jersey herd of W. L. and Mabel W. Baker of Canary, Oregon, made a very good showing on her first official test for in 365 days she yielded 653.58 pounds of fat and 11,742 pounds of milk.

She was started on this test when she was two years and two months of age and she carried her calf for 256 days of the year, thus qualifying for a silver medal. Her milk averaged 5.57 per cent fat for the year.

Violet's St. Mawes Gypsy is by Waltz's St. Mawes Chimes, a grandson of Poppy's St. Mawes, and the son of Waltz of Ashnook, the cow which has a record of 580.30 pounds of fat. Her dam is Blossom's St. Mawes Violet, a cow which has a junior two-year-old record of 614.72 pounds of fat, his dam is by Blossom St. Mawes, a son of Poppy's St.

Mawes, and she is out of the medal of merit cow Rosaires Koffee.

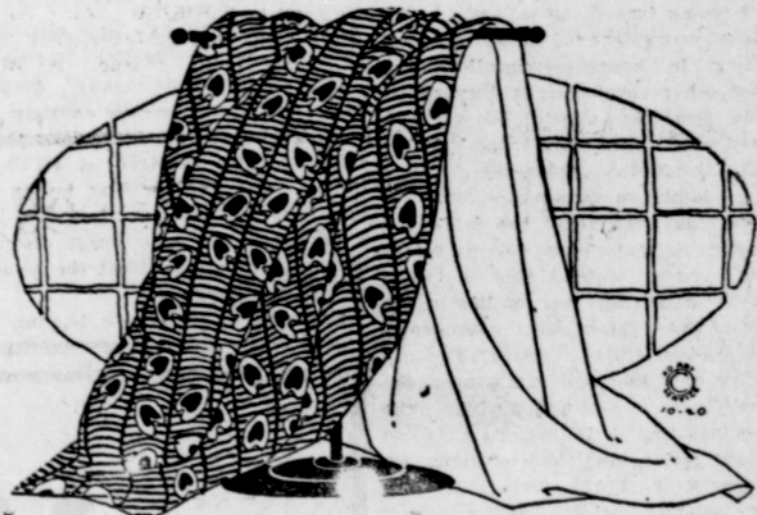
