OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Brief of Resume of Happenings the Week Collected for Our Readers.

Cherry picking got under way in Union county Monday. Picking at first included only Royal Anna, but the harvesting of the black cherries will begin next Monday. Cove growers expect to harvest from 60 to 75 carloads.
Forest Grove is to have a booster club known as the Daffy-dills. About 35 business and professional men will be members of the club and the uniform will feature Forest Grove's newest industry, the growing of daffodils for market.
The prized blue-back salmon have started their run up the Columbia river and fishermen are reporting fair catches. The run of salmon this year has been far below normal, it is reported. Fishermen are receiving 13 1/2 cents a pound.
By unanimous vote the Ashland city council repealed an ordinance passed two weeks ago prohibiting all public dances in Ashland. The city attorney will prepare a resolution on this question for submission to voters at the November election.
State prison officials report receipt of the first load of flax for the season nearly a month earlier than usual. Harvesting of the crop is in full swing throughout the Salem district. The product this year is said to be plentiful, of an unusually good quality.
The Public Service league, sponsoring the state income tax bill with property tax offset, has filed its completed initiative petitions with Secretary of State Kozler. The petitions contained a total of 28,206 certified names, or nearly twice as many as are required to place the measure on the ballot.
Three thousand acres of land in the Wood river valley, 70 miles north of Klamath Falls, which depends upon Anna creek for a supply of irrigation water, will be seriously hit by drought this season, according to Joseph Jensen, county road engineer and Klamath representative of the state water master, who made a comprehensive survey of the Fort Klamath situation.
At the closing session of the Oregon State Fire Chiefs' association convention at Corvallis, Roy Elliott, chief of the Medford fire department, was elected president; William Nusbaum of Eugene, vice-president; Ivan Pearson of McMinnville, second vice-president; James Fletcher, Roseburg, treasurer, and Thomas Yoates, Tillamook, secretary. Salem was chosen for the 1927 convention.
Completely out of control, the largest forest fire in the district during the past two years is doing thousands of dollars of damage 15 miles southwest of Klamath Falls. The fire is in the midst of a virgin stand of yellow pine timber, owned by the Weyerhaeuser Timber company. A second forest fire, 20 miles west of Klamath Falls in the Spencer creek watershed, is also raging uncontrolled.
The public service commission of Oregon renewed its petition for a cross-state line in a brief filed with the interstate commerce commission at Washington, D. C., asking a reopening of the case against the Central Pacific railroad. In its declaration the state commission strikes again at control of the Central Pacific by the Southern Pacific, insisting that conditions no longer justify such an arrangement.
There was a noticeable decrease in production, new business and shipments for West Coast Lumbermen's association mills for the week ended June 19, compared with the record made in those items for the week previous, according to the weekly comparative report issued by the association. The report showed 104 mills last week produced 169,961,902 feet of lumber. New business totaled 114,783, 183 feet and shipments totaled 101,405,817 feet.
At the highway commission's session in Portland the famous "Devil's Punch Bowl" was given as a park to the state by F. W. Leadbetter. The government will be asked to cede all off-shore islands to the state; a warning was issued that the commission will request corrective legislation against use of new six-wheel trucks, 8 new projects were ordered advertised for the meeting on July 23, and various contracts were awarded, approximating \$225,000.
Signatures on an initiative petition circulated in 1924 to place a measure on the ballot of that year cannot be used in initiating a measure to appear on the ballot this year, according to Attorney-General Van Winkle. His opinion was given to Sam Kozler, secretary of state, in connection with an attempt by the Progressive Civilization league to revive petitions which had been circulated in 1924 in order to place an anti-capital punishment measure on the ballot.
