ORDINANCE NUMBER 504 An Ordinance providing for the construction of cement sidewalks abutting the property described in section one (1) of this ordinance, said property being in the town of Springfield, Oregon.

THE TOWN OF SPRINGFIELD DOES OBTAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. The Common Council of the town of Springfield hereby declares its intention and does hereby declare it to be expedient that cement sidewalks, to replace all wooden, loose gravel or earthen sidewalks, be constructed along the streets and abutting the property described as follows: On Third street, West side of Block Six, Lots 4 and 5 Extended Survey; On Second street, east side thereof from Main street to F street along Blocks 5, 2, 27, 26, and 4 in Extended Survey and Block 93 in Springfield Investment and Power Company Addition; On Mill street, the east side thereof, from Main Street to D street along the west side of Blocks 4, 22, 49 Extended Survey; On the South side of Block 2 Original Plat; On North side of B street, Block 22, Extended Survey; On the South side of D street East from Mill street, Lot 3, Block 49, Extended Survey; On the North side of D street between 2nd and 3rd streets, Lots 7 and 8; On South side of D street between 3rd and 4th streets, Block 29, Extended Survey; On the East side of 9th street from Main street North to F street; On both sides of A street from 9th to 10th streets; On South side of C street from 9th to 10th streets; On West side of 9th street from Main street to E street; On South side of B street from 9th to 10th street; On both sides of A street from 9th to South side of B street between 8th and 9th streets; East side of 7th street between A and B streets and South side of B street between 7th and 8th streets; On 6th street between B and C streets, Lot 1 East side Block 7; South side of C street between 5th and 6th streets, Block 7; On the North side of B streets from 2nd street East to Railroad; Block 29, the South side of the Block on C street and East side of Lot 8, Block 29 on 4th street; South side of C street between 7th and 8th streets, Block 75; East side of 7th street between B and C streets; East side of 7th street from C street North to alley, Block 80; North side of D street between 5th and 6th streets, Block 1; North side of E street between 4th and 5th streets; East side of 4th street between D and E streets; Corner of 6th and E street, North side of E street and West side of 6th streets, Block 90; Corner of 6th and E street, East side of 6th, Lot 10, Block 82; Both sides of E street between 8th and 9th streets; Corner of 8th and E street North side of E and West side of 8th; South side of F street between 8th and 9th streets, one Lot center of Block; Corner of 4th and F street; G Street between 4th and 5th streets, North side thereof; Corner of 6th and G street; Corner of 6th and G street; G street between 5th and 6th streets; Masters property; North side of G street between 6th and 7th streets, one-half of Block from 7th street West; South side of G street, one-half Block West from 7th street; North side of F street between 8th and 9th streets; East side of 7th street from the North alley line in Block 108 to K street.
