Oregon's dollars should make Oregon industrially or at least go half way. For years we have been expecting some capitalistic Santa Claus to come among us and shower the land with factories and prize industrial enter-We would then enjoy the fruits of increased business, land and property values and enlarged cities; All without effort in this direction on our part. All we need to do, we tell ourselves, is to boost for them and occassionally pay a little money into the Chamber of Commerce development fund.

The industrial enterprises that have been on the verge of entering and developing our state for years have not come except in rare occasions. We might as well make up our minds now that if Oregon is to be developed to the extent industrially that it ought to be, Oregon's dollars must do it. Factories must be built by Oregon people and Oregon money must go into large coopera tive enterprises matching the outside money-Otherwise what capitalist will care to invest his money in a state where the people are industrial-

The new Salem Linen mills are magnificent examples of what Oregon capital can do. There are others in Salem and Portland where most of the factory developments have taken place.

Many hundreds of thousands of dollars from Oregon go into stock and bonds in eastern states and not those we think we should have. each year. Oregon's dollars are helping develop ment here. Neither can we expect eastern capitalist to have confidence in our state when by are able to do industrially to make this state.


