

ORDINANCE NUMBER 512
 An Ordinance declaring the costs of sidewalk improvements in the Town of Springfield, Oregon, on the following streets: Third street, Second street, Mill street, Main street, B street, D street, 9th street, A street, C street, 7th street, 6th street, E street, 4th street, 8th street, F street, G street, 5th street, levying an assessment for the payment thereof, directing the entry thereof in the Docket of Town Liens and declaring an emergency.

THE TOWN OF SPRINGFIELD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
 Whereas, the town of Springfield did by Ordinance Number 504 provide for the construction of cement sidewalks within the town of Springfield, on the following streets: Third street, Second street, Mill street, Main street, B street, D street, 9th street, A street, C street, 7th street, 6th street, E street, 4th street, 8th street, F street, G street, and 5th street at the cost of the property abutting thereon.

The council has ascertained and does hereby declare the cost of said sidewalk construction to be \$8,028.77. And it is further found and declared that the property liable for the cost of said sidewalk construction, and the proportionate share due from each lot or part of lot abutting thereon, is as hereafter set out.

It is further ordered that the proportionate amount of the costs of said improvement as hereinafter set out be, and the same are hereby assessed and levied upon the property abutting upon and benefited by the improvement.
