

**HUNTLY RESIDENCE IS ENTERED BY BURGLARS**

Forcing their way through the back door of the M. B. Huntly residence at 206 South Second street, burglars ransacked at random through the house and escaped unseen with jewelry and other articles valued at more than \$200.

The house-breaking occurred last night between 5 and 7 o'clock. Mr. and Mrs. Huntly left the place at 5 o'clock, locking the doors. When they returned at 7, they found the back door wide open and entering discovered that the place had been ransacked from end to end by the marauder.

The intruder apparently left the house in a great hurry, probably as the Huntly automobile entered the yard at 7 o'clock. His feet became entangled in an electric cord lying on the floor, and he dragged this from its socket as he rushed for the door to escape.

All of Mrs. Huntly's jewelry was stolen, including eight pairs of earrings, bar pins, and rings.

Police Chief Jess Smitson is investigating the burglary on the theory that it was perpetrated by the same person or persons responsible for robbery of the High school and Lincoln school buildings last week-end.

making of franchises. If the voter approves of the above changes he should approve of the whole new charter to be consistent. To disapprove of any other provisions of the charter is to disapprove of the old charter under which he must continue to live should the new charter be voted down.

The voters will make no mistake in approving the new charter, but disapproving it is to plunge the city into financial difficulties in regard to the \$7,000 fire truck bonds and to perpetuate further trouble in disposing of any bonds the city may issue.

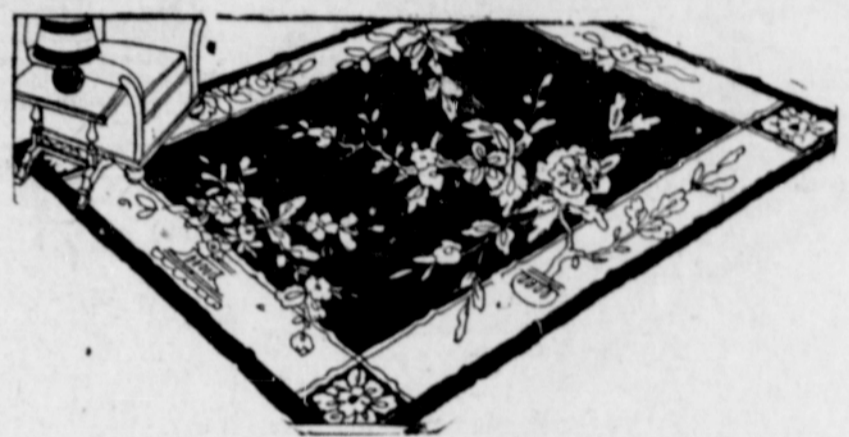
Baby Son Born—Mr. and Mrs. Francis M. Dowdy of Walthville are the parents of a baby son, born Sunday.

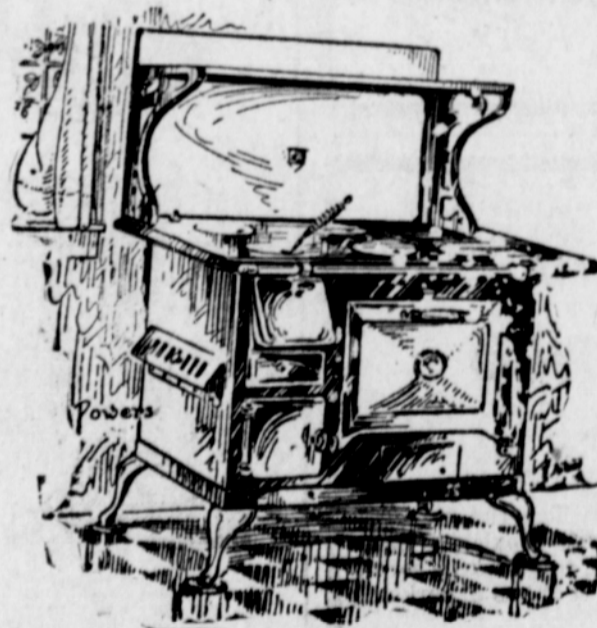
