LAND TO BE OPENED FOR HOMESTEADING

About 23,900 acres of re-vested Oregon and California Grant Lands and Coos Bay Wagon Road Grant Lands in this district will be opened to entry under the homestead law, on March 15, 1927. Some of this land is the land that has been withdrawn for power sites, part of which will be opened to entry with the power site reserved, and some of it is land on which timber has been sold and removed. No purchase price will be required for the cut-over land, but the usual \$2.50 per acre charged for re-vested land must be paid for all other lands to be opened.

Ex-service men of the late war with Germany may begin filing applications on February 23, 1927, and all applications filed from that date to and including March 14, 1927, will be considered as filed at the same time, and a drawing had for all conflicting applications. Ex-service men will so have preference right to file on the land until June 13, 1927, and on June 14, 1927, the land will be open to entry by the general public. Settlers claiming preference right by virtue of settlement on the land prior to December 1, 1913, should file their applications from February 23 to March 14, 1927.
