UNIVERSITY CROWDED FOR LIBRARY SPACE
University of Oregon, Eugene, Ore., February 3 (Special)—Reading space for less than nine per cent of the students of the University is provided by the present library building, according to a report made to President Arnold Bennett Hall by M. H. Douglass, librarian.

Mr. Douglass, in addition, recommended the expansion of courses in elementary library training in order to increase the efficiency of student workers and to give those preparing to teach or become librarians an opportunity to learn modern library methods.

At present, Mr. Douglass pointed out, the library is used as the main study hall because of present methods of teaching and because many students have no other suitable places. At much expense and inconvenience, he said, it has been necessary to borrow reading space in other buildings thus decreasing the amount of room available for classes.
