Colds are unlikely, if the body is first-class condition. Good, wholesome. nutritious food is a preventive. if properly taken. Ample, comfortable clothing, plenty of rest and sleep and a tranquil state of mird, will keep cold in the background.

If you have a cold, correct the bowels and kidneys, and stay in-doors till well; you have no right to appear at gatherings, snort, sneeze and cough—to infect other.

#### McEWAN SAYS SHOULD BE NO PROFESSIONALISM

UNIVERSITY OR OREGON, Eugene, Ore., Feb. 3-(Special)-Competitive athletics between colleges should be fostered, there should be no commercialism or professionalism, and all athletics should be under strict faculty control, declared Captain John J. McEwan, head football coach, in an interview today.

"I pity the book-loving student who spends four year in a University without any physical development," McEwan said. "The men on our athletic teams are not the ones who need physical development.

"Athletics should be developed because they create an interest in the sport, they foster institutional rivalry, they are inspirational, they advertise the college, they arouse college spirit, which may be narrow mindedness but so is patriotism, love for one's mother, and love for a wife."

McEwan is at present interested in watching the development of the athletic problem at Reed college. which he characterized as "a fine little college without intercollegiate athletics."
