NORTHWEST EMPLOYMENT CONTINUES ON UP-GRADE

Portland, Feb. 17. - (Special) - Employment in most of the fir districts of the west coast continues to increase gradually week by week, according to the 4L employment letter issued here today, which stated that there is noticeably less unemployment than was the case in mid-January. The strike of shingle weavers in the Grays Harbor district, where 13 mills have been closed and nearly 1000 men idle for the past two weeks, is still in effect. Several logging camps in this district have been closed, but there has been no strike in the camps.

Conditions in the Inland Empire districts are improving. Every week sees more pine sawmill operations starting up for the season. Woods work there is still in full swing. Railroads are working more men than recently and other lines of work are picking up.

Little change in fir sawmill operation is to be noted. Logging in the Puget Sound and Columbia River districts is being increased.
