University of Oregon, Eugene, Ore., March 3-(Special)-Paul Tracy, of Springfield, senior in the school of journalism, won the second prize of \$100 in the Murray Warner contest. according to the findings of the judges issued Wednesday. Phil. T. Bergh, of Roseburg, senior in business administration, received the first prize and an ward of \$150.

The Springfield girls who will use nimble fingers in the contest this afternoon follow:




REBEKAHS WILL HOLD DISTRICT MEET HERE
