GENERAL EMPLOYMENT BETTER; FIR MILLS LESS ACTIVE THAN MONTH AGO

Portland, Ore., March 31.—With the real spring weather of the past few days outdoor employment in general in the Pacific Northwest has taken an upturn and farm and all outdoor jobs have been more plentiful than for some time past, according to the 4L employment service here. There are still more men than jobs, the 4L stated, but the situation is slightly better than it was a month ago.

From Spokane comes reports that a number of pine sawmills have started the season's cut, although in most cases plants have started with one shift, whereas last year two-shift operation was the rule. Agricultural, railroad and highway work is getting under way here. Damp ground has slowed logging operations in the Inland Empire.

There has been little change in the fir logging schedules. While 80 per cent of the camps are operating, few are running at capacity. Fir lumber manufacturing slumped last week when several large mills were closed down temporarily. Announcements of other shutdowns to become effective during the next two weeks also have been made.

Calls for agricultural workers are increasing. Many men have left for the Alaska fishing grounds, and clamming is in full swing at Oregon and Washington beaches. Building and general construction continues active. Highway, road and bridge work in the Pacific Northwest is being started and men are employed for this work as fast as materials and machinery can be assembled and crews organized.
