### MANY ON UNIVERSITY SUMMER SCHOOL FACULTY

University of Oregon, Eugene, April 14—(Special)—Four additional instructors have recently been added to the staff of 100 instructors for the University of Oregon summer sessions in Eugene and Portland, June 20 to July 29, it was announced today by Alfred Powers, director of the summer sessions.

Hugh E. Rosson, associate professor of English and law, will teach public speaking and Oregon law in Portland.

Miss Margaret Burr, clinic assistant in the child study department of the Seattle schools, and author of the Seattle entrance class tests, has been secured to give in Eugene courses on teaching of backward children and psychology and education of a typical child, a subject on which she is an authority.

Dr. L. E. Griffin, professor of biology at Reed College, will teach biology and heredity at the Portland session. Miss Ruth E. Halvorsen, instructor in art in the Portland public schools, who will assist Miss Esther Wuest in the four art courses scheduled in Portland.

The irrigated areas in various sections of the state are receiving a large share of the interest focused by the newcomers on Oregon. Within the next month a celebration will be held at Hermiston on the occasion of the opening of the McKay dam. The fact that abundant water available from the McKay reservoir will open to settlement 30,000 acres of land in the Westland, Irrigon, Boardman and Hermiston projects, makes this event of special interest to newcomers. A rapid settlement of these lands is anticipated.

Settlers continue to pour into the Southern Oregon projects, Josephine County still holding the lead in the number of families obtained. Keen interest on the part of the whole com-

munity around Grants Pass in extending a hospitable welcome to newcomers accounts in some measure for their fine record.

Grape growing in Oregon has also extended its fame back even to Virginia, where W. D. Sydnor, an authority and specialist in grapes, has been inspired to sell out his highly developed vineyards comprising seven acres with 4200 vines and come to Oregon. Under the rules of the State Board of Horticulture Mr. Sydnor cannot ship in cuttings of his own vines, but his ardor for coming to the northwest is undaunted and he will purchase Oregon vines upon his arrival.

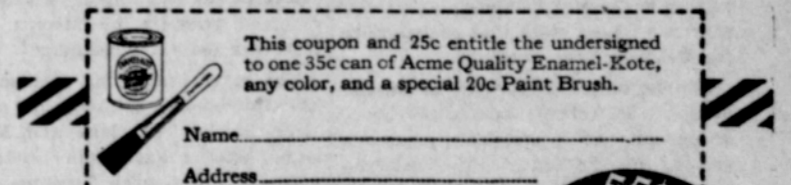
