

ORDINANCE NUMBER 516. AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CEMENT SIDEWALK ABUTTING THE PROPERTIES DESCRIBED IN SECTION 1 OF THIS ORDINANCE SAID PROPERTIES BEING IN THE TOWN OF SPRINGFIELD, OREGON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Section 1. The Common Council of the Town of Springfield does hereby declare its intentions and does hereby declare it to be expedient that a cement sidewalk be constructed as follows:

Section 2. That the sidewalks shall be cement sidewalks and constructed according to the specifications for the construction of cement sidewalks within the Town of Springfield, which has heretofore been adopted by the common council of the Town of Springfield by Ordinance Numbers 437 and 453. That said sidewalks shall be constructed at the expense of and assessed to said properties described in Section 1 of this ordinance, the said properties abutting on said sidewalks.

Section 3. That the owners of the property described in Section 1 shall be each served with a notice containing the substance of this ordinance and such notice shall be served personally by the Chief of Police on such owners, if such owners are residents within the Town of Springfield, and if the owners of such property reside out of the Town of Springfield, or within the Town of Springfield and cannot with reasonable diligence on the part of the Chief of Police, be found therein, a notice containing the substance of said ordinance shall be posted in a conspicuous place upon said adjacent or abutting property or at some point adjacent to and within plain view of the location of the proposed sidewalk for a period of ten days. If the residence or post office address of the owners of such properties are known, and with reasonable diligence on the part of the Chief of Police, can be ascertained, a copy of such notice shall be mailed, postage prepaid, to such non-resident owners and posting and mailing of notice shall be deemed equivalent to personal service. The Chief of Police shall forthwith after such service make and file with the City Recorder due proof by affidavit of the time and manner of such service.

Section 4. If any owner of any of said property hereinbefore described shall fail to construct such sidewalk within ten days after the service of said notice, if personally served, or within twenty days if not personally served, then, in such event, the City Recorder is hereby directed to advertise for sealed bids for the construction of such improvement for a period of ten days in a newspaper published in the Town of Springfield and the common council shall consider the bids therefor and let the contract for the construction of such sidewalk to the lowest responsible bidder. Upon the completion of such sidewalk the common council shall by ordinance assess the cost thereof upon the said abutting property described in Section 1 of this ordinance in accordance with the terms of the City Charter and the ordinance of said city and there shall be included as a part of the cost of the construction of said sidewalk engineer's charges not to exceed five

per cent of the contract price and when said costs shall be assessed the same shall be a lien upon said property described in Section 1 of this ordinance and shall be entered in the Docket of City Liens and enforced in accordance with the terms of the City Charter.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the sidewalk work outlined in this ordinance should be done at as early a date as possible and in order to expedite said sidewalk program for the preservation of the peace, safety and happiness of the inhabitants of the Town of Springfield, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.

R. R. CROSSING REMOVAL PLANNED BY ENGINEER

Plans to eliminate the three railroad crossings on the highway between Jasper and Lowell are being made by County Engineer P. M. Morse. The county has \$10,000 available for this work which will cost nearly \$30,000. It is expected that an agreement can be reached with the Southern Pacific company whereby the cost will be divided.

All three of these grade crossings are very dangerous, being both blind and difficult to approach with an automobile. With the heavy traffic on the new Naton auto line the elimination of these crossings becomes a necessity. After the grade crossings are removed the whole section of the Jasper Lowell will be improved in a manner like the Jacoby hill section was built last summer.

MISLEADING

The day is gone when such terms as "stomach trouble," "liver troubles," "female complaint," "heart disease" and such like, convey intelligent meaning; and yet, many people, when told by the quack that they have liver trouble, or "dropsy," or "neuralgia," are apparently satisfied with the diagnosis. Such statements mean nothing more than to unskillfully point to the location of an unknown pathological condition. It is quite likely that the impostor and ignoramus who "pronounces it colon trouble" knows absolutely nothing of the real condition which he pretends to treat.

Even intelligent newspapers today report that certain citizens died of "Heart trouble" or "Heart Disease!" And this, when there are, roughly speaking, over two dozen easily recognized diseases of the heart and its appendages!

It is against ignorance and cupidity that the honest physician struggles, often too vainly. In years ago, "dropsy" was said to be an incurable disease. Now we know it is only a symptom of disease of some other organ, curable or incurable. Neuralgia is not a disease at all,—it is literally pain in a nerve, and may be due to a number of causes; and upon the removability of the cause, depends the cure of the disease.

How the quacks love to print the cure of Mrs. Jinks' "Female trouble!" They even furnish her newspaper portrait, so eager are they to aid suffering humanity. It is amazing that some people are so unsophisticated that they read and believe such stuff! The afflicted female probably needed only a stout purge—even if such a personage ever existed; and if she did, she was probably well paid in cash for the "testimonial."
