### GOLD MEDAL HONOR STUDENT AMONGST LEADERS

With a record of having attended school for twelve years without being absent or tardy, Miss Lillian E. Snyder of Hundred, W. Va., Miss Mabel Seal of Picaune, Miss., and George Irving of Orville, Ohio, are tied, and now have the lead, in the national contest being conducted through The Publishers Autocaster Service of New York City. The next best record is that of Caroline Grubbs, of Junction City, Ky., who led last week with a record of ten years, seven months and fifteen days, without having been absent or tardy.  
George Irvin, Jr.—17 years old—Orville, Ohio, above, has a remarkable record of being the only honor student of the school winning a gold medal last year and again this year. The medal is based on attendance, scholarship, leadership and athletic activities.
