ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
IN THE COUNTY COURT FOR LANE COUNTY IN THE STATE OF OREGON.

In The Matter Of The Guardianship Of Henry Wilson, an insane person.
This matter coming on for hearing before me this 23rd day of May, 1927 upon the petition of Walter Price, the duly appointed, qualified and acting guardian in the above entitled matter, praying for authority and license to sell the real property of the above named Henry Wilson; and it appearing to the Court and the Court finds as follows:

That the said Henry Wilson is the owner of the following described property in Lincoln County, Oregon, to-wit:
Lots two, three and four in the northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section thirty-three in Township eight south of Range ten west of the Willamette Meridian, Lincoln County, Oregon, containing one hundred and seventy-four and twenty-nine hundredths acres.
Also, the Southeast quarter of Section seventeen, in Township thirteen south of Range nine west of the Willamette Meridian in Lincoln County, Oregon, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

That said two tracts of land are timber lands against which taxes are now due and payable and that the said guardian is not able to pay the same without completely exhausting the cash fund of said ward which he now has on hand. That the said estate has no income and that the said Henry Wilson has no income being now confined in the State Hospital at Salem, Oregon and that said guardian has no means of providing funds to meet the payment of taxes on said property from time to time as the same become due, and that said guardian believes that it would be for the best interest of said ward that said real property be sold and the proceeds thereof put on interest or invested in some productive stock, under the supervision of this Court.

That the said ward has no next of kin in the state of Oregon so far as known to said guardian and that his next of kin in Margaret Cheasty Lonergan, now living at No. 3 Jones Street, Worcester, Massachusetts.
NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the next of kin of said Henry Wilson, and all persons interested in the estate of said ward appear before this Court, at the County Court House in Eugene, Lane County, Oregon, on the 28th day of June, 1927, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of said day to show cause, if any they may have, why license and authority should not be granted for the sale of said premises for the purposes set forth in said petition.

FOX TO GIVE POULTRY DEMONSTRATIONS IN JUNE

Two demonstrations on caponizing and on dressing poultry for market will be conducted in Lane County on Tuesday, June 7, by Professor F. E. Fox of the poultry department of the Oregon Agricultural College, according to O. S. Fletcher, county agricultural agent, who is cooperating with Arnold D. Collier, county club leader, in making plans for the meetings.

The first meeting will be held at the farm of F. M. Porterfield, two miles north of Eugene city limits on the Pacific highway at 10:00 A. M. The second demonstration will be conducted at the farm of S. W. Smith about two miles northwest of Coburg on the middle or power line road at 2:00 P. M. The county agent states that all persons interested in learning how to do caponizing or properly dress poultry for market are invited to attend one of these demonstrations.
