## FARM MARKET REVIEW

(Prepared by L. R. Breithaupt of O. A. C. Extension Service)

**GRAIN**—Trade reports of rust development in spring wheat states, particularly South Dakota, together with an active demand for moderate offerings of new winter wheat, held the market firm during the week ending July 2. Private estimates of the new crop are higher than official estimates of June 1. Foreign markets were firm with supplies of old wheat light. Corn prices advanced from lateness of the new crop which is making only moderate progress. Markets for oats, rye and barley on the whole were slightly weaker, but scarcity caused a firm market for good malting barley.

**WOOL**—Further strength is manifested by some shifting from purchases for immediate needs only to forward buying by mills. An attempt is being made by the wool industry to stabilize and expand the market for woolen goods. Mohair continues quiet with interest fairly well spread over the various sorts.

**BUTTER**—Markets in general were a little softer for the week ending July 1, especially on lower grades. This tendency was more noticeable in eastern than in western markets. Production is still running well ahead of last year's in eastern producing districts and receipts on the markets are liberal. In the west production has probable passed the peak and there is still some shortage of stored stocks.

**LIVESTOCK**—Heavy steers were scarce and steady on the markets last week but poorer grades of cattle weakened somewhat. Hog markets showed a little disposition to improve in spots. Fat lamb prices went lower with heavier receipts.

## SUMMER WORK NOW AT PEAK 4-L REPORT

Portland, July 6—(Special)—Industrial, agricultural and construction activities, except logging and lumbering, are now nearing seasonal peak, giving employment to practically all available men and women in the Pacific Northwest, according to the 4-L employment letter published here today. Reviewing employment conditions West of the Cascades the 4-L reports:

Industrial activities have been temporarily slowed down because of Fourth of July holidays. Logging camps began to shut down or contract operations early in June and it is now estimated that not more than 50 per cent of fir capacity will actually log during July.  
More than 5,000 loggers who were laid off before the Fourth are marking time waiting for camps to reopen, while hundreds have gone east of the mountains and elsewhere for the harvest or have taken local construction jobs.

The annual Fourth of July closing of sawmills has averaged five days. Sawmill operation continues spotted, and with more or less curtailment of actual production in nearly every district.  
Agricultural, canning factory, railroad, highway, tourist, mining and industrial activities, except logging and lumbering, are at midsummer peak. The number of unemployed is low, but those without work find it difficult to secure jobs suited to their experience. It is equally difficult to secure skilled help promptly for jobs offered. Turn-over in all lines is low.  
East of the Cascades both logging and lumbering is more nearly normal than in the fir districts, according to the 4-L letter. There are now but few skilled woodsmen, sawmill or planer men unemployed in the pine districts.
