Yours is a problem which no advice of mine can help you solve, for as far as the woman is concerned in such cases, it is a question of being miserable if you do make confession, and miserable if you don't. Frankly, I fail to see the wisdom of telling the man you love of your past. If you don't confess, at least you will be the only one who will be unhappy—and that unhappiness will not be lasting. He will be haunted always by the memories of what you have told him.
