**NEW FACULTY MEMBER COMES TO UNIVERSITY**

University of Oregon, Eugene, September—Dr. Clara Willard Smertenko, former head of the English department at Skidmore College and previous to that head of the Greek department at Grinnell, has been added to the faculty of the University of Oregon, in the Latin and Greek department, it was announced today by Dr. James Gilbert, dean of the college of liberal arts and sciences.

Dr. Smertenko is not only an educator of national note, but is well known as a writer and contributor to many journals in the United States. She is also the author of an authoritative book in her field, entitled "On the Interpretation of Empedocles." Dr. Smertenko will take the place of Stanley Yates who was forced to relinquish his post on account of ill health.

During the late war, Dr. Smertenko was in the Y. M. C. A. hospital service and saw service in France with the First Division, A. E. F.

John Stark Evans, of the school of music at the University, was a major in Dr. Smertenko's department at

Grinnell, and speaks very highly of her ability.

Announcement was made recently that a corn and fruit show will be held in Roseburg during the latter part of October, sponsored by the Roseburg Rotary club. This show will take the place of the land products fair, which was abandoned for this year.

Six freight cars were derailed in the Southern Pacific yards at Roseburg when some person handling the train endeavored to crowd 75 cars on a 50-car track, misjudging the capacity of the track. An open derail switch allowed the cars to go over a bank.

Oregon's birth rate decreased slightly last year, while the state's death rate remained stationary, according to an annual summary for the birth registration area issued by the department of commerce. The bright spot in the summary was reserved for Portland, which reported the lowest rate of infant mortality for 1926 of any city 37.2 for each 100 births. The infant mortality rate for the whole state of Oregon was 51.6 a thousand births, but that was the lowest figure given for any state among the 28 from which complete returns were obtainable.
