ERECT PERCHES AROUND

LIGHTHOUSES SAVE BIRDS

London, Eng., April 5 (Autocaster) -The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds has erected large perches around the tops of various lighthouses which are on the birds favorite flying route around the British Isles.

The bright beams of the lighthouses are responsible for the deaths of tens of thousands of birds annually. They are attracted like moths to a candle by the brilliant light, and finding no refuge the flocks in numerous instances fly round and round until exhausted and finally drop into the sea.

The same beams now point the way to a haven of rest. Feed boxes are also provided.
