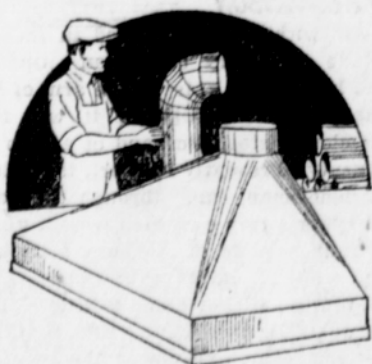
Hour of church services has been advanced for the winter season.

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VOTERS MUST REGISTER BEFORE OCTOBER 6, IS WARNING OF ATTORNEY

Springfield people who expect to vote in the coming general election and who are not already registered must register not later than October 5, according to I. M. Peterson, city attorney.

Unless the voter has balloted within the last two years he must register. The same provision holds true if he has changed his residence from one precinct to another. Voters who registered for the primaries and have not changed their residence since will not, of course, be required to register.

There will be no swearing in at the polls at the general election, Mr. Peterson pointed out. This practice has been abolished both in the primaries and the general election.
