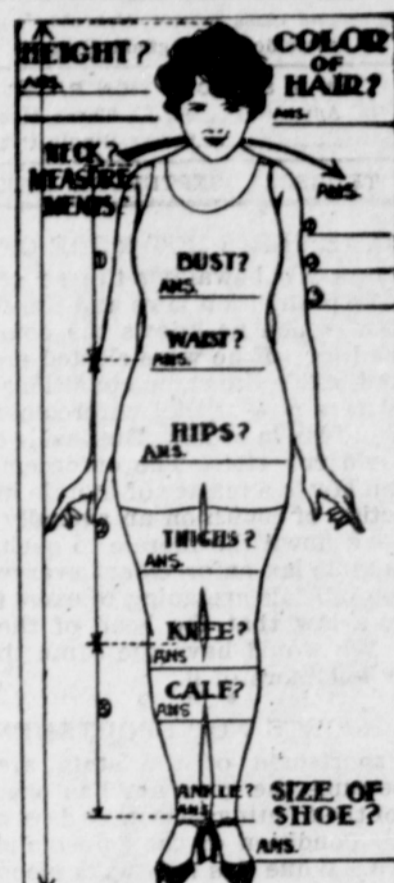

### BUSINESS IN SOUTHERN OREGON BETTER, REPORT

Business in southern Oregon, and particularly in and around Roseburg, is gradually betting back to normal after a marked slump, according to J. O. Newland, one of the leading automobile distributors of that city, who was a visitor here Monday. Mr. and Mrs. Newland, who were on a trip to Portland, stopped over to visit Postmaster and Mrs. F. B. Hamlin. The two women are sisters.

With the tourist season still good and with produce coming in in big volume, business men of Roseburg are prospering more than at any time during the past year, Mr. Newland stated. Construction of a big mill, which is under way there, is expected to make up in a measure for removal of Southern Pacific shops from there some two years ago.

### RAILWAY COMPANY PAYS LARGE SUM IN OREGON

A total of \$13,477,976.68 in wages, taxes and for material and supplies during the past year's operation was spent by the Southern Pacific company according to a statement by J. A. Ormandy, assistant passenger traffic manager, just issued.

Taxes accounted for \$1,517,360.68, wages for \$8,960,616.00 and material and supplies for \$3,000,000.00.

The company has more than 5,200 employes in Oregon. The company now has 1400 miles of track in this state in addition to the highway service of the motor transport division.
