GUARANTY TRUST PURCHASE BUILDING

Owners to Move Into New Home Which is Being Remodeled to Suit Their Needs; Eugene and Springfield Men are Stockholders and Directors.

(Daily Journal Commerce)

Probably the most important real estate transaction of the month involves the transfer yesterday of the Western Bond & Mortgage building, located at the northeast corner of Broadway and Oak street, to the Guaranty Trust company of Portland. The transaction involves the purchase of the building from the Western Bond & Mortgage company and its 30-year lease on the land from Messrs. Keller and Boyd, owners of the Benson hotel.

The consideration was not made public, but it is known that the structure was erected five years ago for the purpose of housing financial institutions at a cost in excess of \$150,000, while the ground lease calls for a net rental equivalent to 6 per cent on \$350,000.

Immediately following the closing of the deal Carl L'nde, architect on the building when it was constructed was commissioned to draw plans for remodeling to suit the tenants.

In reality circles the total property is said to represent an investment of over a half-million dollars.

The transaction was negotiated through Bullier & Bullier, Portland realtors. The Guaranty Trust company was represented by Joseph M. Healy and C. L. Boss acted for the Western Bond & Mortgage company.

C. H. Farrington, president of the Western Bond & Mortgage company, state that the Western Bond & Mortgage company was retaining space in the building and continuing its operations as heretofore; that the Guaranty Trust company, on account of its increased activities, required more space than its present location afforded thus enabling the Western Bond & Mortgage company to make a satisfactory disposal of its property.

The Guaranty Trust company, headed by A. J. Perkins, is largely controlled by Eugene capitalists.

Mr. Perkins, president of the Guaranty Trust company, said:

"We have purchased the Western Bond & Mortgage building in order that our concern might own its home office building in Portland's financial district. We believe that we have made a profitable investment. The building will be remodeled quite extensively, and we expect to start work immediately. Our offices will occupy a large portion of the ground floor of the building, and the rest of the space will be leased out to other financial institutions. We have retained Bullier & Bullier, realtors, in the Porter building, for this last purpose. The building will be known as the Guaranty Trust company building."

Space will be arranged to provide suitable quarters for the Western Bond and Mortgage company, and two other concerns whose names are withheld for the present, according to Albert Bullier. There is, however, a small amount of space still available.

This transaction is significant in that the Equitable Savings and Loan

SENATOR BAILEY FOR KINDERGARTEN LAW

Salem, Feb. 27.—"There is not much argument as to the advantages of the kindergarten," Senator Edward F. Bailey, Junction City, said in discussing the well known house bill 201 which was passed by the senate recently. The amendment provides that only taxpayers can vote in such elections.

"Children in the first grade who have had kindergarten training show much more aptitude," declared Bailey. "Kindergartens have a tendency to do away with 'repeaters.'"

Senator Bailey also pointed out that the average per capita cost of a child in the first grade is \$75 to the taxpayer. The per capita cost of kindergarten students is \$52 per year.

"Only four states in the Union, including Oregon, do not have kindergarten laws at present," concluded Senator Bailey.
