FALLING PULLEY CAUSES DEATH OF G. HICKMAN WEST FIR CO. EMPLOYE

George Hickman, 64, an employe of the West Fir Lumber company met death yesterday afternoon sometime between 4 and 5 o'clock when an 800 pound pulley fell upon him. . Mr. Hickman was cleanup man at the mill and had gone to the place where the pulley was hanging to clean from under it. When he did not appear the other men working there went to look for him and found him pinned to the ground by the immense pulley. The body was immediately taken to the office of H. W. Dobbins, at West Fir. Mr. Poole of the Walker-Poole company went up last night and brought the body to Springfield.

The deceased was born September 20, 1865, in Ohio, later moving to Wisconsin where he married Iva Bower. He moved to Oregon in 1918 and has been in the employe of the West Fir Lumber company six months.
